McGRATH BUYS INTO SQUASH IRELAND

TROSTAN LTD. has acquired a "large" interest in Squash-Ireland, the commercial squash concern. Trostan Ltd. is a company jointly owned by Senator P. W. McGrath and Mr. Alan Jeffers, who manages McGrath family investments.

Trostan has bought out the original co-director of Squash-Ireland, Mr. John Collins, and has injected further capital into the

company, according to a press statement received yesterday. The other original director, Mr. Stanley Lewis, remains as managing director of Squash-Ireland and will be joined on the board by Mr. Jeffers, the statement added.

There are Squash-Ireland centres in Rathgar and Dalkey. Within a few weeks a six-court Clontarf centre will open, and a four-court centre in Limerick should be underway. Within the next 12 months centres are planned in Foxrock, Dartry and Castleknock, the statement added.

At Dartry a 7-court centre is to be started next month. The main court will have a glass back wall with seating accommodation for over 200 spectators and standing room for the same number. It will be equipped for television coverage of major events. The centre will also have a swimming pool, gymnasium, table tennis, billiard facilities and restaurant.
